



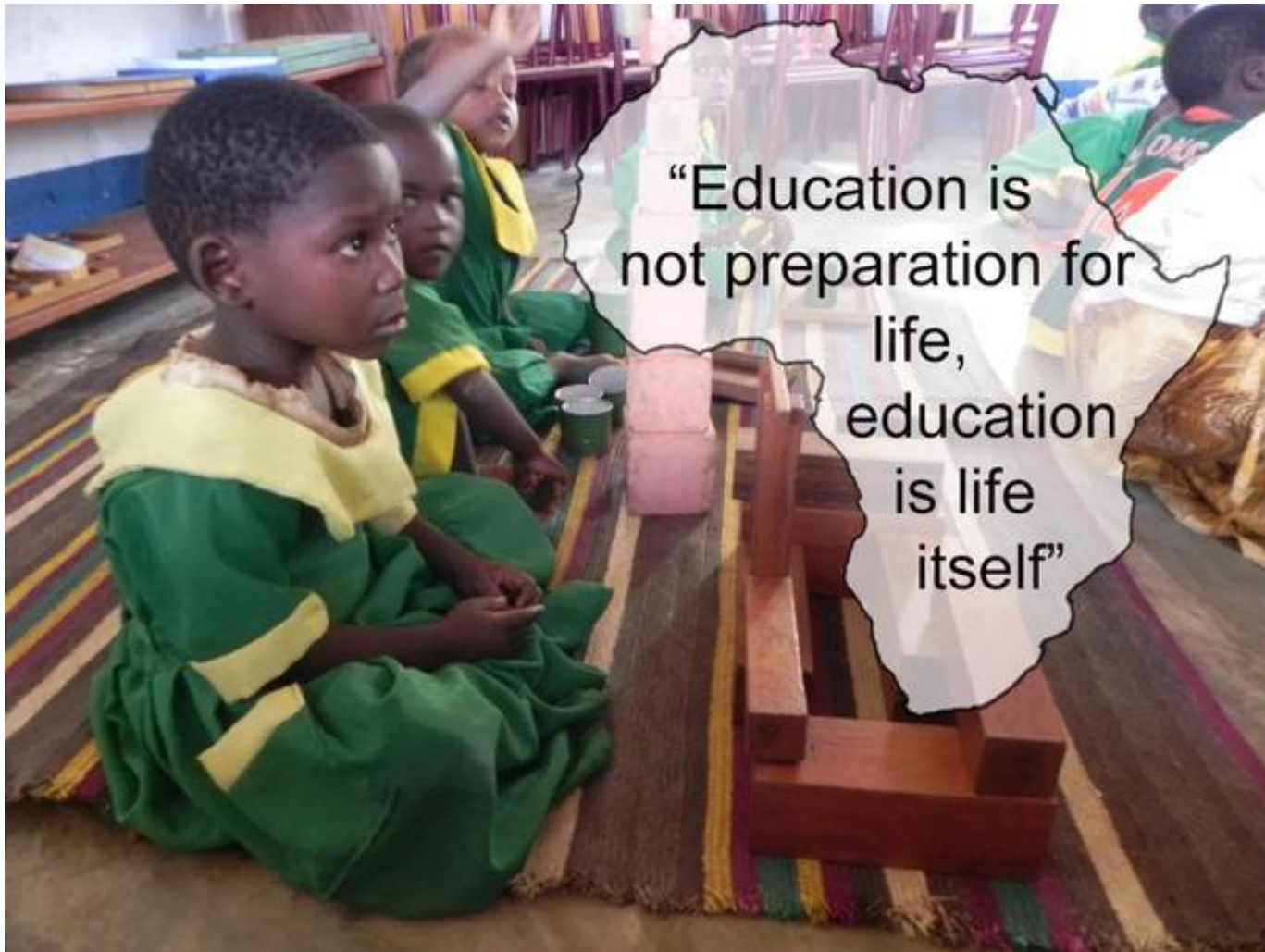

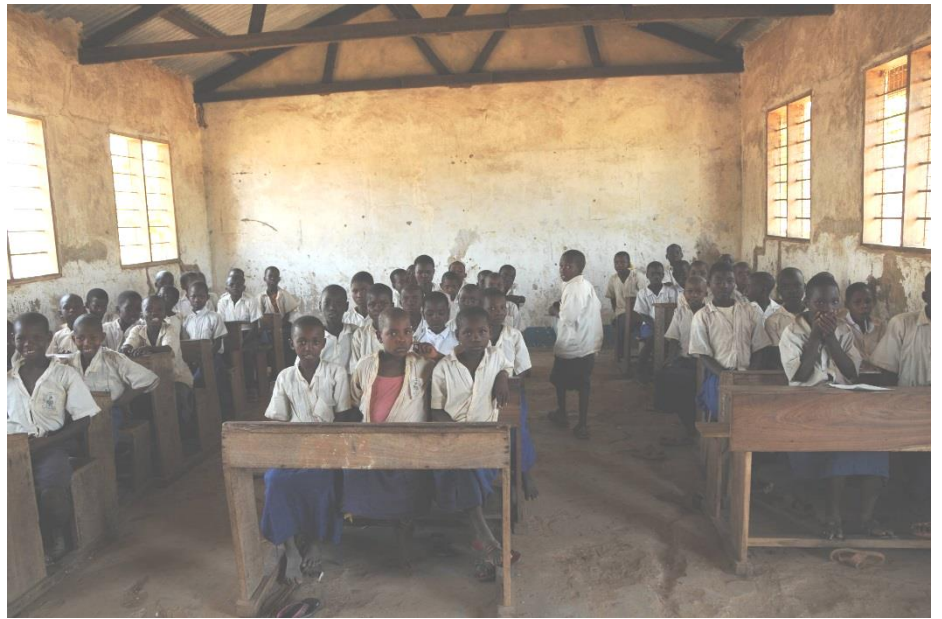




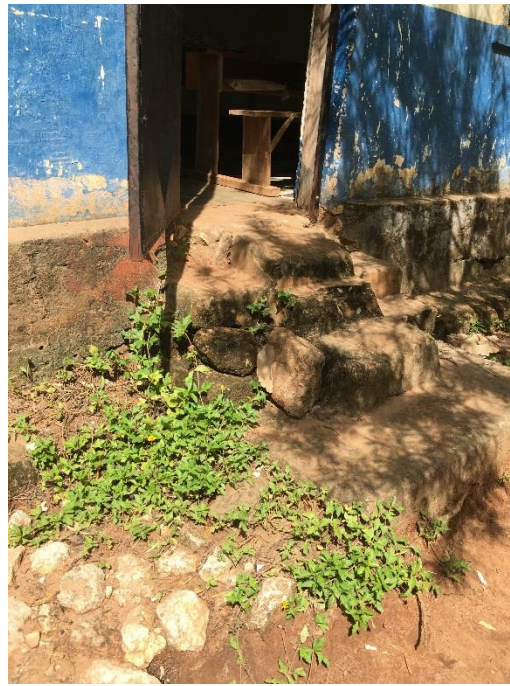




How EdUKaid helps
