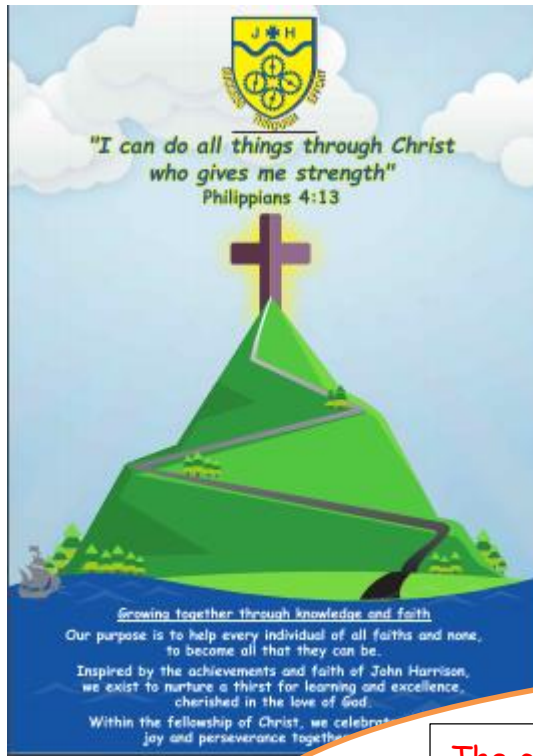


John Harrison C E Primary School.
